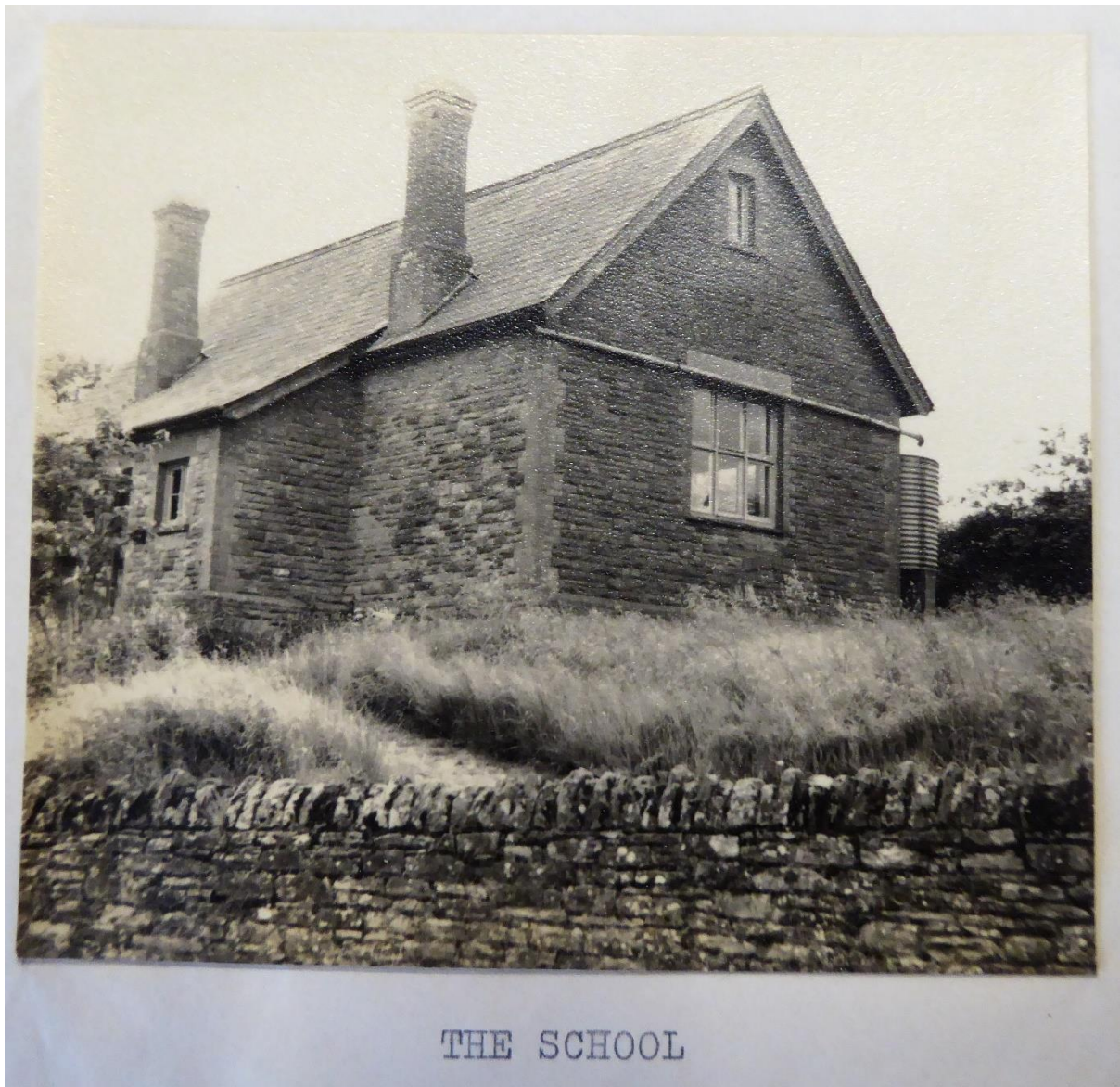
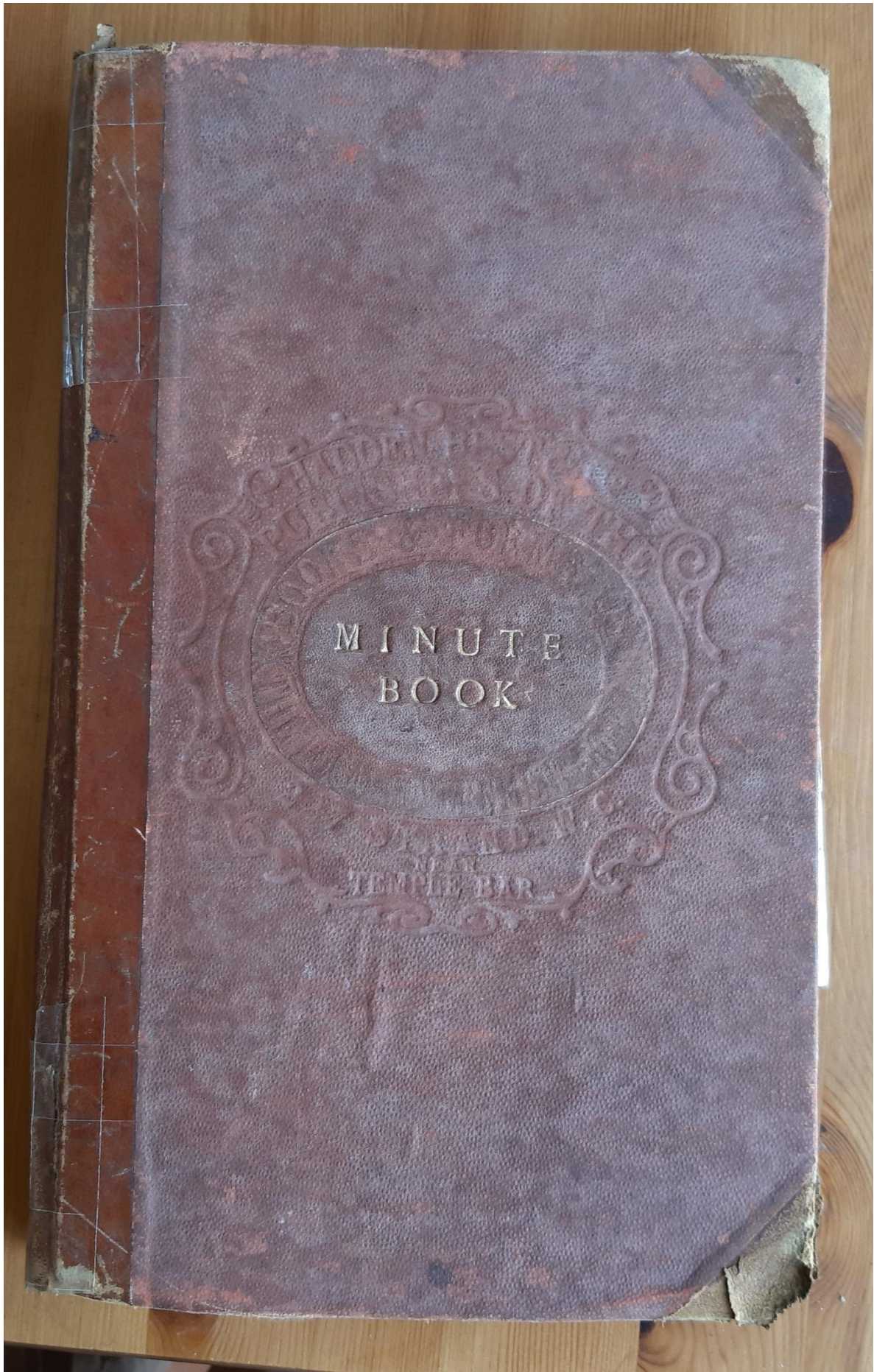


The Minute Book of Callow Village School

1878
April 16.

A meeting was held at the Callow School-room to pass Bylaws under the Education Act. Present Rev. A. W. Horton, Messrs A. Struttage, W. Morris & W. W. Morris (Treasurer). It was resolved upon the motion of Mr. Morris that the Rev. A. W. Horton be requested to forward to Mr. T. H. Stanwix the Clerk of the Hereford Board of Guardians the printed form of application for Bylaws to enable the School Authority to enforce the attendance of the children in the School District of Dewesall with Callow. The distance within which the Bylaws should be in operation was fixed at 1/2 miles.

A meeting of the School Committee held this day at the house of Mr. Denny, present Rev. A. W. Horton Chairman & Messrs A. Struttage & W. W. Morris, the accounts of the year ending November 30th 1878 were examined & approved & the balance in the Treasurer's hands was found to be £ 35. 2. 3 1/2.

At a Committee Meeting held this day at Dewesall Court, present A. Struttage Esq, Major Bennett, Mr. W. W. Morris & Rev. A. W. Horton. - The accounts were examined & it was resolved that we have sufficient in hand to dispense with the Collection of any Subscriptions this year. It was agreed that Miss Ravenscroft be allowed £ 5 out of the grant on her leaving in addition to salary due to December 12. The application from Mary Jane Rogers having been received it was agreed that her Second Class Fare from Pembroke Dock be paid out of the School Funds.

At a Committee Meeting held this day in the School room - present Rev. A. W. Horton in the chair, Arthur Struttage Esq, Major Bennett, Mr. Walter W. Morris - an application for an increase of salary of Miss Mary Morris at present receiving £ 40 per ann. - was considered and it was agreed that Miss Morris be offered a gratuity of £ 3. in addition to her salary of £ 10 for the quarter now due - and that she shall receive a similar gratuity for the coming year, it being understood that any future gratuity will be liable to be affected by the amount of future Government Grants received. It was agreed that Decima Whiting shall be engaged at 2/ per week as Monitor for the

ending remainder of this year -
 In consequence of the lamented death of Mr. Walter Morris
 of Jewsball Court and the removal from the
 Parish of Father of Mr. James Tomes it was
 agreed that Mr. Walter Morris now of
 Jewsball Court and Mr. James Carter of
 Leyford be appointed members of the
 Committee which now consists of

 Mr. Walter William Morris of Jewsball Court

 May 22nd

A Meeting was held this day at the house
 of Mrs. Durney present Rev. A. W. Horton
 Chairman Arthur Armistead Esq. Major
 S. M. Bennett & Mr. W. W. Morris. - Mary
 Anne Dance was appointed Montrose at
 2/- per week. The accounts were examined
 & found correct to this date the balance
 in hand being £ 31. 9. 6. The Treasurer
 was asked to see Mr. Hatford whose
 children should be charged 2/- per week
 his residence being in the Parish of Stou-
 bury & it was decided that the children
 from the Haywood & Knockersville should
 be charged 2/- as non-Parishioners.

 April 10th

A Meeting of the Committee was held in Miss
 Morris Room present Rev. A. W. Horton in the
 Chair, Arthur Armistead Esq. Mr. W. W. Morris
 & Col. Bennett. It was resolved that Miss
 Morris shall be allowed a certain portion of
 the garden attached to the School Cottage (which
 portion was then marked out) & shall pay
 £1 Rent for the same that amount to be
 deducted from the Rent to be paid by
 Walter Morgan which will thus stand at
 £ 3 per ann. Miss Morris expressing a wish
 to have a new entrance to the cottage with
 steps from the road opposite to the door was
 told by Mr. Armistead that this would not
 be objected to if done at her own expense.
 The question of the addition of a class-room
 to the School Building was then introduced
 to the Meeting by the Chairman who handed
 to Mr. Armistead the Report of N. P. Inspector
 S. W. Pitt-Williams in which it is stated
 that such additional accommodation is
 necessary on account of the number of
 children & that the neglect of it would im-
 peril the Grant. Mr. Armistead being strong-
 ly urged by the other Members present to
 obtain some pecuniary assistance for
 this matter from Guy's Hospital promised
 to bring it under the notice of the Gover-
 nours & took away with him the Report
 for that purpose.

Nov - 23rd

A meeting was held at Mr^s Dimery's, present
Rev. A. W. Horton, Chairman, Arthur Ammitage Esq
& Mr. W. W. Morris. Since the last meeting
the school has been subsidised by Guy's Hospital
& the school has been enlarged by the addition
of a play room built by Mr. Court at a cost of
£105. Also the cottage has been improved
by an alteration in the staircase making
the mistress's rooms larger. - A notice
having been received from the Schoolmistress
of her intention to resign her post - Miss
Morris then attended the meeting & it was
agreed that she should carry on the school
to the end of the first quarter of 1887 re-
ceiving the salary to that date. - Proposed
by the Chairman & seconded by Mr. Morris
it was resolved that in consequence of the in-
creased number of scholars a gratuity of
£4 of the grant should be given to Miss Morris
in addition to the above. It was lastly
agreed that the Treasurer should call for a
voluntary ~~grant~~ ^{contribution} as heretofore.

May 31st

A meeting was held at Mr^s Dimery's, present
Rev. A. W. Horton, Chairman, Ernest Ammitage Esq
Messrs A. H. Morris & J. Carter. It was proposed
by the Chairman & seconded by Mr. Ammitage &
carried that Mr. Arthur Morris be appointed
Treasurer in place of the late Mr. W. W. Morris.
An application from Miss Logan for a rise in her
salary being presented it was decided to give
her $\frac{1}{4}$ of the grant in addition to the £45 at
present received by her. Mr. Carter's subscription
was fixed at £1 instead of £1-5. Letters were
read concerning the little school at Troopers
Mr. Ammitage having given notice to Mrs. Powell
that her salary will terminate at Michaelmas.
A letter was also read by Mr. Horton from the
Rev. A. Brierley of Bullingdon with reference to
a proposed new school in that parish, but this
it was considered will not affect us at present.

Guy's Hospital. It was decided to request that
the children in Standards III to VII be individually
examined at the Inspection in January next.
The question of sending two managers to the
Meeting of the Rural Deanery/Confederation of
Church Schools was raised by the Chairman
but it was decided that he should attend the ensuing
Meeting, alone Mr. Morris' accounts were examined.

Mr. A. Dance from 4/6 per week to 5/6. Mr.
Morris' accounts & the bank passbooks were exam-
ined & approved.

A meeting was held at Mrs. Dimery's present
Rev. T. M. Dunn (in the Chair) Messrs. A. H. Morris,
William Andrew, and Tho. Carter & Mrs. Dimery,
to take into consideration tenders submitted
to meet the requirements for improvements to
the Out Offices of the School Buildings demanded
by the Education Department. There were three
tenders submitted, one by Mr. Geo. Court, one by
Ruben Taylor; and one by Henry Addis.
Proposed by Mr. A. H. Morris that the tender
for £29 by Mr. Henry Addis be accepted. This
was ~~accepted~~ seconded by Mr. Tho. Carter, and
was carried unanimously.

It was also agreed that a subscription be made
by the ~~parishioners~~ ^{parishioners} to meet the required for
the above improvements as shown by the
plan produced and accepted, and approved
by the Education Department.

A Meeting was held at the house of Mr Henry M. Drew, Callow.
Present: - Rev. Eldred Morgan, Chairman; Messrs A. H. Morris, W. Andrew, J. Carter, and H. M. Drew.

The Rev. Eldred Morgan made reference to the death of Mr. Pimory, and in a suitable manner proposed a vote of sympathy with Mr. Drew who was now to take his place. She had been for many years a School Manager and Subscriber to the School Funds. This was seconded by Mr. Morris and carried.

Mr. Morris proposed, and Mr. Carter seconded that Mr. Henry M. Drew, be appointed a School Manager - Carried. The Treasurer gave some particulars with regard to the School Funds. There was a little falling off in the average attendance of the children; and hence the Government Grant was not quite so much as in the previous year.

It was decided to make the required alteration in the School Gallery, or to substitute Desks to meet the requirements of the Education Department.

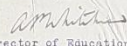

TITHE ACT, 1936
Explanatory Memorandum

1. Creation of Redemption Annuities

All tithe rentcharges and extraordinary rentcharges charged on land immediately before the 2nd October, 1936, were extinguished on that date and, in lieu, redemption annuities were charged under Section 3 of the Tithe Act, 1936, for the period commencing on that day and ending on the 1st October, 1986.

A redemption annuity is payable to the Tithe Redemption Commission by half-yearly instalments on the 1st April and 1st October of each year (Section 16 (b)). The amount of each instalment is calculated in accordance with Section 47 (4) of the Act, which provides that fractions of a penny less than a halfpenny shall be disregarded, and fractions of a penny amounting to a halfpenny or more shall be treated as a whole penny.

Documents to prove the existence of a redemption annuity or of the original tithe rentcharge are available for inspection at this office.

2. Liability in respect of Redemption Annuities

An instalment of an annuity payable on any payment date is a debt due to the Crown from the person who is on that date the owner of any land in respect of which the annuity is charged. "Owner" normally means a "freeholder", but in certain circumstances (paragraph 13) may mean a "leaseholder". In a like manner, a payment required by a Redemption Notice is a debt due to the Crown from the person on whom such a notice is effectively served.

The fact that a landowner makes repayments to a mortgagee (e.g., a Building Society, local Council), in respect of a loan for the purchase of the property does not mean that the mortgagee is responsible for payment of the redemption annuity charged in respect of the property. In such cases, the deeds of the property are held by the mortgagee as security for the loan and ownership of the property remains with the person to whom it was conveyed.

No payment made either in respect of an annuity instalment or in respect of consideration money for the redemption of an annuity has now any connection with the original tithe-owners, religious or otherwise.

3. Authority for Proceedings

Under Sections 11 (1) (a) and 15 (3) of the Tithe Act, 1936, the Commission are empowered to serve on a landowner a formal Notice requiring the compulsory redemption of the annuity or annuities charged in respect of his land in any case in which his total annual liability amounts to £1 or less in respect of land owned by him in any district, or of adjacent land in another district owned by him in the same capacity.

If it is claimed by a landowner that his annual liability in respect of redemption annuities exceeds £1, he should so inform the Commission and give the reference number of the demand notes which he has received either from the Commission direct or from their locally appointed Collectors.

INSTRUMENT OF MANAGEMENT MADE BY THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION UNDER SECTION 17(2) OF THE EDUCATION ACT, 1944.

The MINISTER OF EDUCATION hereby ORDERS as follows:—

Interpretations

1. In this Instrument the expression "the Local Education Authority" means the County Council of the Administrative County of Hereford and, where a function has been delegated to a Committee of the County Council or to any Sub-committee of such a Committee, includes in relation to such function the Committee or the Sub-committee to whom the exercise of such function is delegated.

Other expressions to which meanings are assigned by the Education Acts, 1944 to 1948, shall have the same meanings for the purposes of this Instrument.

The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply to the interpretation of this Instrument as it applies to an Act of Parliament.

Body of Managers

2. The body of Managers of each School (hereinafter called "the School") specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Instrument shall, when complete, consist of:—

TWO Foundation Managers, being:—

One *ex-officio* Foundation Manager, being the Principal Officiating Minister of the ecclesiastical parish or district within which the School is for the time being situated. Provided that if the said Minister refuses to act, or is absent from all the meetings of the Managers during a period of twelve months, or there is a vacancy of the benefice, the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry within which the School is situated may from time to time appoint some person to act as substitute for the said Minister for such period as he thinks fit; and

One person, being a member of the Church of England, to be appointed by the Hereford Diocesan Council of Education after consultation with the Parochial Church Council of the said ecclesiastical parish or district; and

FOUR Representative Managers to be appointed:—

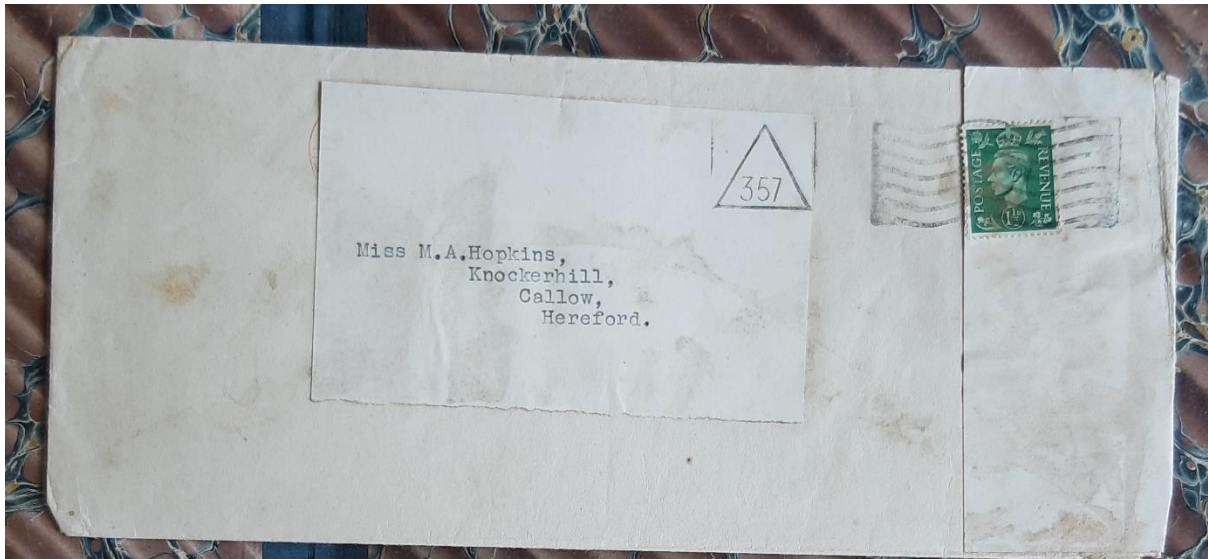
Two by the Minor Authority specified in the second column of the Schedule in this Instrument, and

Two by the Local Education Authority.

Managers, other than *ex-officio* Managers, need not be members of the appointing body.

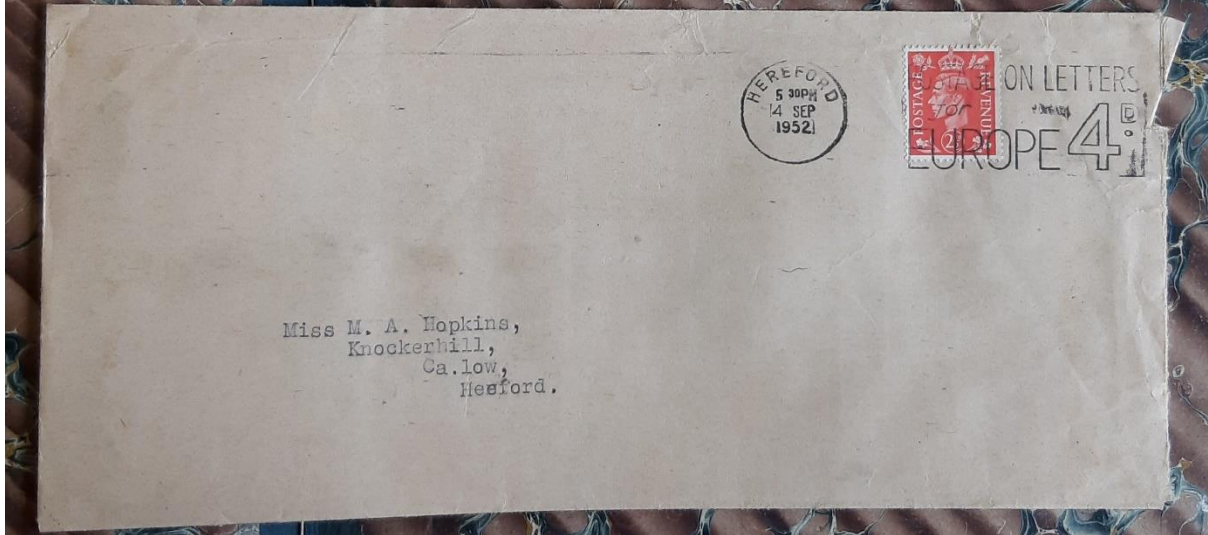
Term of Office

3. Every Manager to be appointed by the Local Education Authority shall be appointed for a term of office ending on the date of the appointment of his successor, which may be made at any time after the ordinary day of retirement of County Councillors next after his appointment. The other Managers, other than the *ex-officio* Managers, shall hold office for a term of three years.
